2025 SPRING SEEDLING INFORMATION

American Arborvitae (Thuja occidentalis)	Narrow, pyramidal shaped evergreen that can be used as a hedge or windbreak. It is a slow to medium grower with a mature height of 40' to 60'. It prefers full sun and acidic, clay, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, silty loam, well drained soil. It provides shelter to wildlife and seeds for birds and squirrels.
Norway Spruce (Picea abies)	This pyramidal, pendulous branched evergreen grows between 40' and 60' in height and by 25' to 30' spread. It is considered medium to fast growing. It bears 4" to 6" long cones. It performs well in moist, sandy, acidic, well drained soils in full sun to very light shade. It is commonly used as a windbreak.
Tulip Poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera)	This tree is a member of the magnolia family. It produces tulip shaped, light greenish yellow flowers April to June. It is rapid growing and reaching heights of 80' to 120'. It does best in moist, deep;, well drained soils. Requires full sun, but can tolerate partial shade.
Paw Paw (Asimina triloba)	Also known as the Poor Man's Banana or Hoosier Banana. It is a deciduous, often narrow, conical, tree growing 12' to 25'. The dark green leaves grow up to 12 inches in length. In March to May they produce maroon, upside down flowers that measure up to 2 inches across. The large edible fruit is produced, often in clusters from the blooms. Its taste is described as a cross between a mango and a banana. Harvest time is mid August to mid October. It should produce fruit in 5 to 6 years. It grows best in full sun once established. Plant in deep, fertile soil that is well drained and slightly acidic.
American Redbud (Cercis canadensis)	For many years, this is the seedling preferred for our Annual 2nd Grade Arbor Day Program. It has a medium growth rate, growing to 20' to 30' in height with a 25' to 35' spread. It is a small tree producing rosy pink to purplish flowers in March to April. Young seedlings should be planted in moist, well drained clay, loam or sandy soils and in full sun to partial shade.
White Walnut (Juglans cinerea)	Also know as butternut. The white walnut grows rapidly on well drained, moist rich soils of hillsides and streambanks. The white walnut's nuts are sweet and edible. It prefers full sun to partial shade.
White Oak (Quercus alba)	It grows 50' to 80'. It has dense foliage that is bluish-green, to reddish-brown in autumn. It grows best in a deep, loamy, well drained soil. It is the tree from which the phrase 'Mighty Oak' was coined. It is known for its broad, round head, and massive, wide spreading, branches. It is an excellent specimen tree needing plenty of room to mature properly. Also, it is the most prolific lumber oak in the Northern Hemisphere. They are a long lived tree, and require very little maintenance. Native to eastern to mid United States. Full sun, partial sun/shade preference. Slow to medium growth rate. The acorns provide a source of wildlife
Hybrid Poplar (Populus deltoides x Populus nigra)	Extremely fast growing, cotton less shade growing tree up to 80 feet. Dark green leaves, spring through fall, turning yellow in the fall. Long lived. should be kept mowed and weed-free. Plant 50 feet away from drains and sewers. Full sun preference and acidic, alkaline, wet soil preference.
